A Record Setting Year

Thanks to the spirited support of donors and friends, the GNTC Foundation enjoyed a record-breaking year in terms of fundraising and the number of students awarded aid. With a focus always on student success, the Foundation launched an ongoing communications campaign that shared the stories of students, told in their own words. In addition, the Foundation was able to secure a number of new scholarships and major gifts.

Turning Student Setbacks into Comebacks

- Over \$98,000 in scholarships and financial assistance was awarded to 350 students in Fiscal Year 2021.

- Emergency and gap funding grants of over \$35,500 were awarded to 135 students.
- Awarded \$4,380 for high school equivalency testing fees for 77 students.

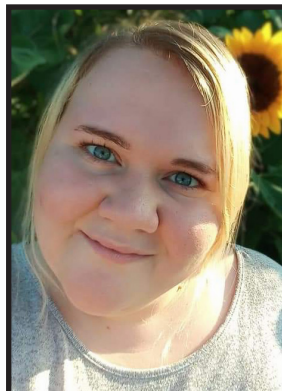

GNTC 2021 Highlights

Meeting a Rising Demand for Healthcare Workers

The rise of COVID-19 has brought a new demand for healthcare workers at every level with the American Nurses Association projecting a need of 1.1 million new registered nurses by 2022 to avoid a shortage in the field. Georgia Northwestern Technical College is using its 60 years of experience to help meet the needs of the workforce in the northwest Georgia region. According to enrollment data from Fall 2020, healthcare students comprise 25% of GNTC's student population.



Articulation Agreement with Dalton State College Creates New Opportunities

Georgia Northwestern Technical College and Dalton State College have established articulation agreements that allow students graduating from select GNTC programs a transition opportunity into specific Dalton State four-year degree programs. The agreements were signed by the presidents of both colleges. The first agreement allows graduates from Georgia Northwestern's Automation Engineering Technology, Industrial Systems Technology and Instrumentation and Controls Technician associate degree programs the opportunity to continue their education in Dalton State's Engineering Technology bachelor's degree program. The second agreement allows graduates of GNTC's Networking Specialist associate degree program the opportunity to advance into Dalton State College's Information Technology bachelor's degree program.



GNTC Names Mohawk Industrial Systems Lab and the Shaw Automated Manufacturing Lab

Georgia Northwestern Technical College announced its partnership with Mohawk Industries through the company's recent sponsorship of the Industrial Systems Technology lab and Shaw Industries recent sponsorship of the Automated Manufacturing lab on the Whitfield Murray Campus.

Gold and Silver Wins at SkillsUSA National Competition

Four Georgia Northwestern Technical College students earned first in the nation at the SkillsUSA National Leadership and Skills Conference in the TeamWorks category. This is the second year GNTC's TeamWorks team has won gold at the national competition. All six of the GNTC students that took part in the national competition placed in their respective events.

A Partnership between the Floyd County Prison and GNTC produces workforce ready welders

A total of 24 offenders at the Floyd County Prison completed training provided by Georgia Northwestern Technical College and the Technical College System of Georgia and are now certified in Shielded Metal Arc and Flux Core Welding. A special commencement ceremony was hosted by Floyd County Prison Warden Mike Long and Georgia Northwestern at the prison to recognize the second cohort of offenders who have become certified in the two welding processes needed for an entry-level welding position. The first cohort consisted of 12 offenders who were certified in Shielded Metal Arc and Flux Core Welding.

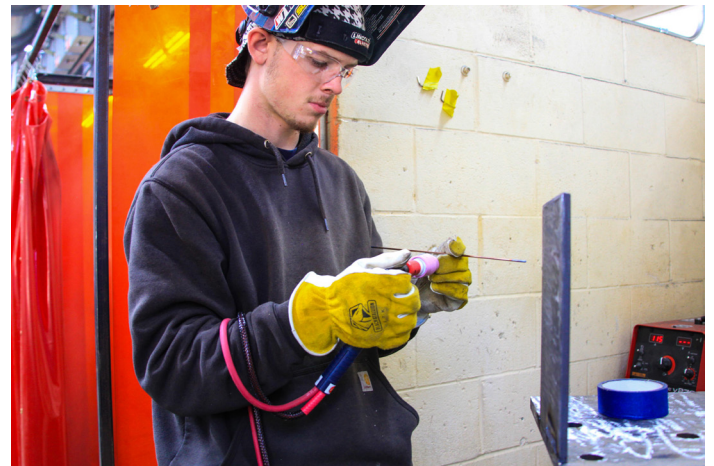
Catoosa County Students Earn Certificates from GNTC

Harper received the Helicopter Association International Women in Aviation International (HAI/WAI) Maintenance Technician Certificate Scholarship. Harper is a former accountant making a career transition to aviation repair.



Foundation Raises Approximately \$250,000 in 2020

The GNTC Foundation raised approximately \$250,000 in support of students from private donations, corporate gifts, grants, planned giving and establishment of an endowed fund. At the conclusion of GNTC's Annual and Year-End Giving Campaign: "A Gift of Impact," the GNTC Foundation raised \$90,464 in scholarship funds, surpassing the original goal of \$20,000 by a large margin. Gifts from GNTC employees alone exceeded \$20,000.

Students Receive The Governor Nathan Deal Scholarship

Four Georgia Northwestern Technical College students received The Governor Nathan Deal Technical Education Scholarship, an award of up to \$2,500 for academic achievement for students enrolled in an industrial program at the Whitfield Murray Campus. The four students, Ashley Vineyard, Logistics and Supply Chain Management; Jose Cruz, Computer Numerical Control (CNC) Technology; Matthew Dunn, Automation Engineering Technology and Stephen Hensley, Automation Engineering Technology, each received a \$500 scholarship. Cruz is the only student who has received the award twice having received it in 2020. Graduates from all six GNTC campuses were invited to attend the drive-thru ceremonies. GNTC's Campus Police led the procession of vehicles that were routed through the WMC and FCC parking lots. Graduates exited their cars in their caps and gowns and walked GNTC's blue carpet to President Dr. Heidi Popham to receive their award. All along the route, GNTC faculty and staff cheered them on with signs and noisemakers.



GNTC Graduate Hired by SpaceX to Maintain Rocket Engines

Georgia Northwestern Technical College Aviation Maintenance graduate Palmer Moye was hired as an Integration Technician for SpaceX in Cape Canaveral, Fla. Through the GNTC Aviation Maintenance Technology program, Moye studied a combined airframe and power plant curriculum, mandated by the Federal Aviation Administration. Through GNTC's Aviation program, students like Moye are able to apply the skills they learn across the aerospace field. During his final interview, Moye worked on a SpaceX Merlin engine. These engines power the Falcon 9 and Falcon Heavy rockets. The Falcon Heavy rocket was the craft SpaceX launched on Feb. 6, 2018, to transport a cherry-red Tesla Roadster and its mannequin driver, Starman, into space.



Commercial Truck Driving Graduate Celebrates Second Chance at Life

Pulling his brand new tractor-trailer truck into the parking lot of Georgia Northwestern Technical College's Walker County Campus, Jeffery Brown, a Commercial Truck Driving graduate, talked with current students of the program about how it changed his life. "Truck driving saved me," he told them. "There is a need for good drivers with a Commercial Driver's License (CDL) and GNTC will teach you everything you need to know."

Brown is a convicted felon; something he said has barred him from several jobs since his release. The GNTC alum said he was not sure where to turn until he found the Commercial Truck Driving program and his entire perspective changed. He reached out to the GNTC Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act Program (WIOA) for help paying for classes. According to Gena Williams, WIOA assistant, Brown qualified for program assistance and was able to receive financial aid. Brown said Williams and the WIOA program came to him with help. It was because of them he was able to complete his classes and graduate.



Student Access to Internet Services Expanded at GNTC

In an effort to bring accessible internet to students, Georgia Northwestern Technical College expanded wireless internet coverage in order to assist students who may have unreliable internet access at home.

Wi-Fi internet access is available to all students in designated areas in the parking lots of GNTC's Floyd County, Gordon County, Walker County and Whitfield Murray Campuses.

Holmes and his students were working behind GNTC's Gordon County Campus where they were building additions to a former maintenance building.



Adult Education Graduate Achieves Lifelong Goal

Two months before his 67th birthday, Jim Gunter received his GED® diploma during Georgia Northwestern Technical College's Adult Education graduation celebration. "I always meant to go back and get it, but something always came up," Gunter said. "It's something that I always held over my head. In the back of my mind I would hear, 'you're a failure, you couldn't even do that.'" Gunter is employed with the Chattanooga-based company Bolts & Nuts Corporation. During a conversation with his boss, Gunter found out his company was considering a program that would allow employees to earn their GED® diploma. "I jumped at the opportunity," said Gunter. "I got in contact with GNTC's Adult Education program and started classes at The Shirley Smith Learning Center in Catoosa County." Executive Chairman of Bolts & Nuts Corporation, Dave Hadani, came up with the new employment benefit and agreed to let Gunter be the first one to participate. The initiative, now offered company wide, allows employees to immediately start working to earn their GED® diploma. Even if it is a personal goal, it is worth going after, said Gunter. He described an emotional burden being lifted once he got word he had passed the program.

Donors Establish a GNTC Public Safety Scholarship

Gary and Diane McConnell established a Public Safety Scholarship through the GNTC Foundation. With a combined public safety career of over 75 years, the McConnell's wanted to assist students in Basic Law Enforcement, Criminal Justice Technology, EMS Professions and other first responder-related programs. Gary McConnell serves as a GNTC Foundation Trustee.

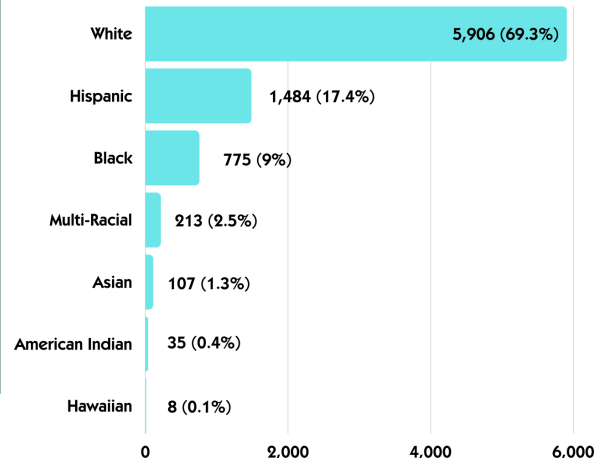

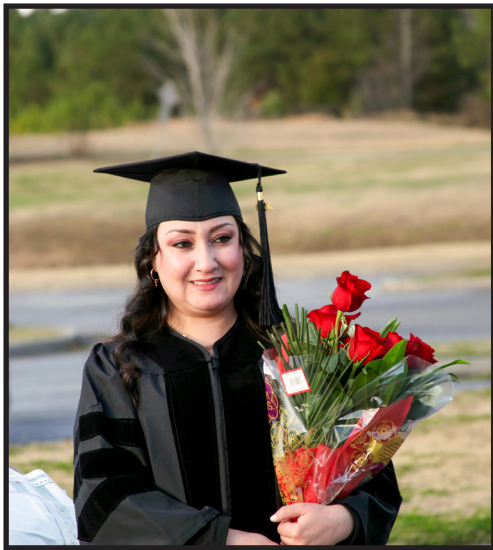




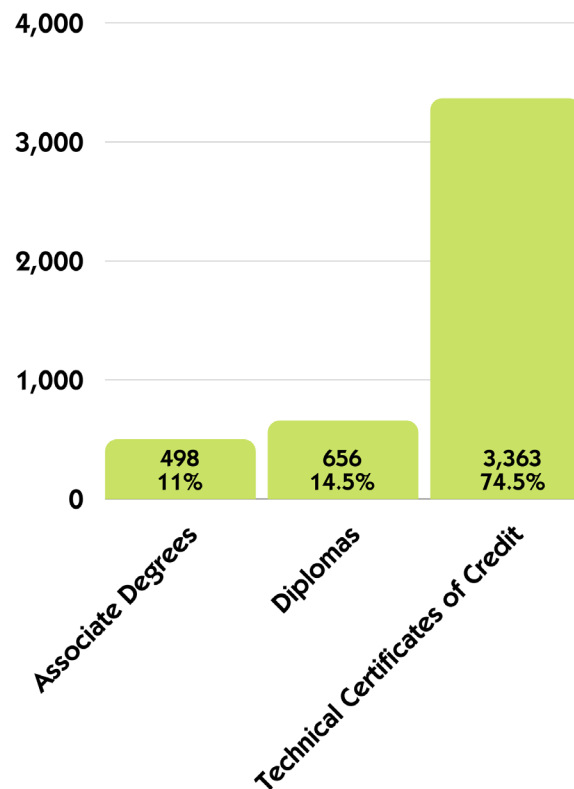

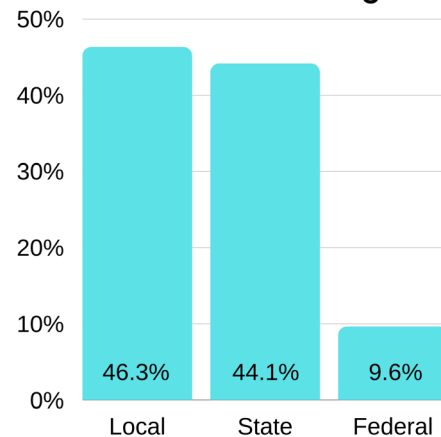
